PROSPECTIVE CORPORATE MEMBERSHIP POLICY:

The following procedures will be followed for the proposal for new corporate membership in the Kiwanis Club of Western Kenosha. Each prospective member must have a current member sponsor them. Corporate membership allows multiple people to share the representation.

- FIRST STEP:** Your name and/or Company is brought before the club for introduction and included in the weekly bulletin.
- You or a company representative are invited to a lunch meeting to meet the group and learn more about our mission. 3 visits are mandatory before final step.
- Your name and/or Company will be on the agenda at the next board meeting to be voted on for membership. If no objection from club members, you will be granted membership pending completion of application and payment of membership fee.
- FINAL STEP:** Induction of new corporate member will happen at the next lunch where all necessary members are present for ceremony. Kiwanis pin will be presented to new member as well as a new member packet.

Our club was chartered in 1958 and has raised over \$1,000,000 over the years to fund many worthwhile projects. Some fundraising events that our club currently manages are as follows: Youth Baseball Programs, Golf Outings, Food Drives, Wisconsin Marathon and Taste of Wisconsin.

Is there a mandatory number of volunteer hours when I become a member?

No, there is not. You or your representatives donate as much time that your life allows and we will make the most of your generosity. The more you are involved the more connected you will become to our club and thus our community.

What should I expect at a weekly Western Kiwanis lunch meeting?

You or your company representative will be greeted by the President of the club as well as all of the members. You are free to sit at any table and discuss your interest in our club with your neighbor. The first 30 minutes consist of friendly conversation and a catered lunch. At 12:30 the President brings the meeting to order starting with singing of "My Country tis of Thee", the Pledge of Allegiance and Prayer, followed by general club business where you will be introduced as a guest.

What if I can't attend the Thursday Lunches?

No problem, after your company becomes a member there are other times where our club meets to discuss business. You can attend the monthly board meetings or any of the sub-committee meetings to get information. There is also a weekly Bulletin that is emailed out so those that can't attend the lunch still know what was discussed. If all those don't fit in your schedule we still welcome you to volunteer and assist with any of our fundraisers throughout the year.
